### Clue 1

From Bloomsbury Square you can see a building that was once shortlisted to be City Hall. Take a photo of it from within the Square.

### Clue 2

Three of the four corners of Bloomsbury Square look onto buildings with European connections. Find the corner that doesn't.

### Clue 3

Bloomsbury Square was redesigned in 1806 by Humphrey Repton, who liked to have views from the spaces he designed. Can you see another green area designed by Repton from Bloomsbury Square?

### Clue 4

The author Isaac Disraeli lived in a house overlooking the Square from 1817-24. His son Benjamin Disraeli, who was Prime Minister of Britain twice, was also born in this house. The house can still be seen from the Square. See if you can find it!

There is an engraved plaque in the Square, which shows a faded depiction of the original Square. The quotation around it is taken from John Evelyn's diary, and talks about when the Square was originally built. Find this quotation in the Square.

### Clue 6

This feature of the Square celebrates an 18th Century politician with a Roman theme. The year that it was added to the Square was 1816, which is written in Roman numerals.
