CLUE 1

In 2012, this spectacular building, designed by architect Zaha Hadid, provided the breath-taking backdrop to countless world records. You could sketch the building on the back of this form. For Games Time it had wings on the sides to accommodate more spectators. What is it called?

CLUE 2

The main entrance to the Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park is over a bridge known by locals as the F10 bridge. It used to be 44m wide, it was reduced in width to 16.5m after the Olympics. What is the name of the bridge which gives access to the Tour Boats and the Swan Pedalos in the Waterworks River below?

CLUE 3

The tall, red structure is called the ArcelorMittal Orbit designed by Sir Anish Kapoor and Cecil Balmond. It is 114.5m tall and there are 455 steps from ground level to the top. Most people use the lift to the viewing platform where you can discover sights including Big Ben, St Paul's Cathedral, the O2 and of course the former London 2012 Olympic venues and park. Check the signs to discover how long it takes to travel down the 178m long slide?

CLUE 4

Walking northwards, away from the ArcelorMittal Orbit towards Tallow Bridge on Tessa Jowell Boulevard, you'll stroll past the 2012 Gardens. These feature plants from different regions around the world. On the way look out for a green strip on the ground representing the distance Olympic long-jumper Greg Rutherford leapt to secure his gold medal. Have a go yourself. How far did he jump?

Continue along the path towards Carpenters Road. Look out for display boards detailing 50 facts on the park. Can you find them? There is one about the Yardley Soap factory near Carpenters Road which closed in the 1960s. According to residents, when it rained you could still "smell the soap" how many years after?
